The ability of systems, communities, and individuals to anticipate, prepare for, and respond to hazardous climate events or changes, minimizing their impact and recovering quickly.

CHILD PROTECTION POLICY 01

PRINCIPLES OF ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY.

The following principles guide SHF's approach to environmental sustainability:

ENVIRONMENTAL RESPONSIBILITY

SHF will actively minimize its environmental impact and ensure that its operations and programs are environmentally sustainable.

CLIMATE ACTION

SHF will contribute to climate change mitigation by reducing greenhouse gas emissions and supporting initiatives that promote climate resilience in vulnerable communities.

RESOURCE EFFICIENCY

SHF will use natural resources efficiently, minimizing waste, conserving water and energy, and promoting sustainable sourcing in all its operations.

POLLUTION PREVENTION

SHF will take steps to prevent pollution in all forms, including air, water, and soil pollution, through sustainable practices and responsible waste management.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Ensure that SHF's strategy and decision-making processes align with the organization's environmental sustainability objectives.

Review and approve major initiatives that involve environmental protection and sustainability.

CEO

Lead the implementation of SHF's environmental policies and ensure compliance with relevant environmental laws and regulations.

Promote a culture of sustainability across the organization and ensure that environmental considerations are integrated into all decision-making processes.

ENVIRONMENTAL OFFICER

Monitor SHF's environmental impact and identify opportunities for reducing waste, conserving resources, and enhancing sustainability.

Coordinate environmental awareness programs for staff, volunteers, and partners, ensuring that they understand and adhere to SHF's environmental policies.

Conduct environmental audits and prepare reports on SHF's environmental performance.

PROJECT MANAGERS

Ensure that environmental sustainability principles are incorporated into the design, implementation, and evaluation of all SHF projects.

Work with beneficiaries and local communities to promote sustainable practices and environmental protection in project areas.

STAFF AND VOLUNTEERS

Follow all environmental policies and practices in their daily work.

Take steps to reduce their own environmental impact by minimizing waste, conserving energy, and using sustainable transportation.

Participate in environmental training and contribute to SHF's sustainability efforts.

PARTNERS AND CONTRACTORS

Ensure that their practices align with SHF's environmental policies, including using sustainable materials, reducing waste, and promoting energy efficiency in their operations.

Work with SHF to implement environmentally responsible projects and programs.

POLICY PROVISIONS.

ENERGY AND WATER CONSERVATION

SHF will take measures to reduce energy and water consumption in its offices and project sites. This includes installing energy-efficient lighting, using water-saving devices, and promoting awareness of conservation practices among staff and volunteers.

WASTE REDUCTION AND RECYCLING

SHF will minimize waste generation by reducing, reusing, and recycling materials. Waste reduction practices will be promoted at all project sites and offices, and staff will be encouraged to limit the use of single-use plastics and other non-recyclable materials.

SUSTAINABLE PROCUREMENT

CHILD PROTECTION POLICY 03

REPORTING PROCEDURES.

ENVIRONMENTAL MONITORING AND REPORTING

SHF will regularly monitor its environmental performance and report on its progress in reducing its environmental impact. The Environmental Officer will be responsible for preparing annual environmental reports and recommending areas for improvement

INCIDENT REPORTING

Any environmental incidents, such as pollution, waste mismanagement, or non-compliance with environmental regulations, must be reported to the Environmental Officer immediately. SHF will take swift action to address any environmental risks or violations.



DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

Employees, volunteers, or partners who fail to comply with SHF's environmental policies or engage in practices that harm the environment will face disciplinary measures. This may include suspension, termination, or termination of contracts.

CONTRACT TERMINATION

 SHF reserves the right to terminate contracts or partnerships with any individual or organization that fails to adhere to the organization's environmental principles.

POLICY REVIEW.



This policy will be reviewed every two years or as necessary to ensure that it remains aligned with evolving environmental regulations, best practices, and SHF's sustainability goals.



The Environmental Officer, in collaboration with senior management, will conduct the policy review and recommend updates to the Board of Directors.
